Stolen Children by Peg Kehret

J Kehret, P. | 165p.

Fourteen-year-old Amy's excitement over her first babysitting job ends when she and her three-year-old charge are kidnapped, but a daily videorecording sent to little Kendra's parents allows Amy to send clues, in hopes of being rescued before the kidnappers decide they no longer need her.

Stormbreaker by Anthony Horowitz

After the death of the uncle who had been his guardian, fourteen-year-old Alex Rider is coerced to continue his uncle's dangerous work for Britain's intelligence agency, MI6.

Swindle by Gordon Korman

J Korman | 252p.

After unscrupulous collector S. Wendell Palamino cons him out of a valuable baseball card, sixth-grader Griffin Bing puts together a band of misfits to break into Palomino's heavily guarded store and steal the card back.

Three Times Lucky by Sheila Turnage

J Turnage, S. | 312p.

Washed ashore as a baby in tiny Tupelo Landing, North Carolina, Mo LoBeau, now eleven, and her best friend Dale turn detective when the amnesiac Colonel, owner of a café and co-parent of Mo with his cook, Miss Lana, is implicated in a murder.

Twelve Minutes to Midnight by Christopher Edge

Writing popular horror tales under a male pseudonym for a best-selling literary magazine she will one day inherit, 13-year-old orphan Penelope Tredwell of Victorian England is asked to investigate strange occurrences at the local insane asylum.

Twisted Summer by Willo Davis Roberts

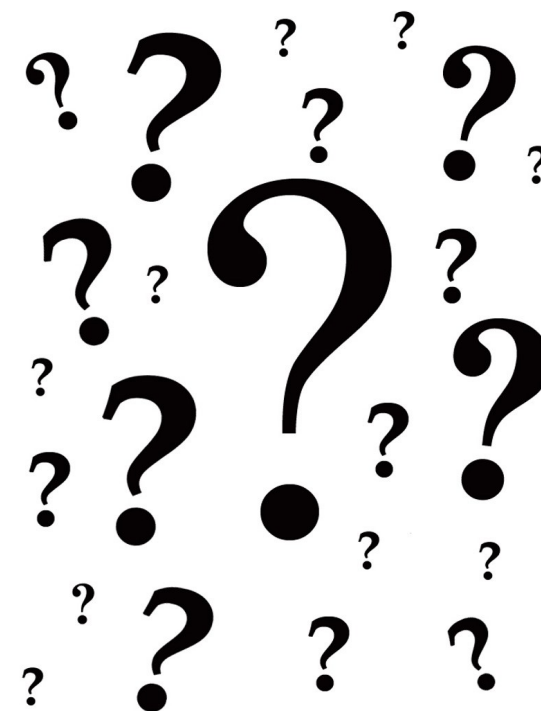
TEEN Roberts, W. | 156p.

Escape from Mr. Lemoncello's Library by Chris Grabenstein

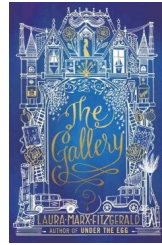
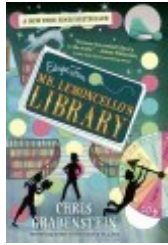
J Grabenstein, C. | 291p.
